Highlights of the Quarter 1 (Oct-19 To Dec.19)

After fruitful meetings with different District Management Authorities and fulfilling Home Department Punjab's criteria assessment REEDS successfully achieved the NOC for Project Implementation in District Rajan Pur.

Baseline Survey Lives Sustainability Program & Digitization of data: A baseline study done with 6220 newly registered and enrolled males and females farmers beneficiary to assess their existing knowledge, information and practices regarding under SLP Modules and Farmer Business Model.

End line Survey Lives Sustainability Program Farmers (2018-19) & Digitization of data: To measure the intended and effects of the SLP year 2018-19 Field team conducted End line survey of females farmers while digitized survey database shared with CC team
 Registration & Verification of Farmers: 7636 beneficiary's identification and Farmer Groups formation, Project Orientation as well as the administrative and management activities of quarter one are successfully achieved.

Establishment of Farmer Groups & Orientation sessions about FBS : Field team along with project coordinator conducted orientation sessions throughout October and November before the start of any activity in target villages to know the willingness of the FG members . Team Introduced the project's and working organization, objectives and benefits to local community to be the part of FBS project.

1. Capacity Building Trainings of Staff

Staff Hiring & Orientation session (TOT) about the project FBS: A briefed orientation and TOT session in which Mr. Shahid Saleem and Ms. Zakia Malik briefed about the FBSP Model with purpose of the planning retreat was to review PSCP progress to date, to discuss project implementation, reschedule, and consider FBSP activities. Total 14 Project Staff members oriented with FBSP to performing their task confidently in field. Farmer Capacity Building trainings.

2. Farmer Capacity Building trainings

Farmers meetings (Farmer Field School): 42 farmers meeting regarding g FFS conducted by field staff

Personal Hygiene , Hygiene on Household and environmental: 2205 project beneficiaries (1350 females 855 males)in 49 VGs enhanced their knowledge on health and hygiene, practice and attitude regarding their cleanliness , hand washing and its practices to adopt at home improved and they oriented with correct methods of hand washing and its critical timings.

3. School Awareness Program

Formation and activation of Children Clubs to promote education and child rights among their peer group

313 children of age (9-18) become members in 21 Children Clubs in Project area for their Capacity building Trainings on Child rights, Child Labor Health hazards, Menstrual Hygiene For girls, SLP approach discussed with them for helping other adolescents and their families in the most marginalized communities

Sessions conducted with Children Club members regarding health and hygiene in which 154 children participated and aware about Hand washing importance with soap and critical timings of hand washing in 11 awareness sessions and importance of education specially for girls.

Highlights of Q-2 (Jan-20 To March-20)

Registration & Verification of Farmers: Project team completed baseline study with newly registered farmers beneficiaries to asses their Existing knowledge regarding Farmers Business School. Digitized data shared with Cotton Connect.

Establishment of Farmer Groups & Orientation sessions about FBS: Project Team continued farmers verification and enrolling the new farmers. Total 264 VG verified and 4964 new farmers registration soft data is completed.

1. Capacity Building Trainings of Staff

One day training conducted on "Kitchen Gardening" with coordination of Agriculture Department (Assistant Deputy Director) Falak Shair and (Senior Officer) Faiz Ullah, of Tehsil Rajan Pur with the objective to develop liaison and coordination for PSCP program at community and Kitchen Gardening training and support. 12 staff members briefed about Kitchen Gardening Importance, Techniques selection of seeds, tools and further action plan developed to support Kitchen Gardening activities.

2. Farmer Capacity Building trainings

Farmers meetings (Farmer Field School): 270 farmers meeting regarding g FFS conducted by field staff

Personal Hygiene , Hygiene on Household and environmental : 169 Health and Hygiene awareness trainings conducted with 6760 (2136 males and 4624) females to determine change in health and Hygiene practice of beneficiaries. F.Es delivered the sessions very well with simple local language to engage the participants in practical activities.

Child Labor & health hazardous for children in cotton production activities : Field team bring attention to the (risks of) negative impact of child labor on child rights and their health; 11634 Farmers acquire knowledge and sensitized about child labor that deprives children of their childhood, Its causes and consequences of child labour, the importance of schooling to improve children's future prospects, and on the negative impacts of child labor on children's health and education shared . Parents recognize their responsibility to respect child rights including combating child labor and mitigate the impact of child labor by enrolling 25 children in different schools.

Importance of Nutritional values and Keys of healthy diet" plus Immunization Importance for mother & child health: Field staff with Farmers under Sustainable Lives Program for whole month of March 2020 through training and advisory services. In the session Field Team demonstrate the introduction to Immunization Importance for mother & child health & Importance of Nutritional values and Keys of healthy diet.

3. Outreach Activities

200 Women identification for KG and Trainings, Selection of Demo Plots Females Capacity building and implementation of Production technology, Provision of Seed Package: Project staff selected the demo plots for kitchen gardening and organized training sessions on kitchen gardening techniques for the identified and selected farmers. Project team distributed seed packs for kitchen gardening among 200 farmers and made the plots with them for sowing.

Celebration of International Rural Woman Day, Interactive Session to promote Women & Workers Rights & empowerment: In the month of March 2020, An event regarding "International Women Day" was arranged on 13-03-2020 at Nadir Public School Rajanpur by REEDS-Pk Rajanpur team. Working women related to social sector, entrepreneur, education and self motivated were invited as special guests. The theme of the day was "I am Generation Equality" All Participants and guests shared their experiences and illuminated the rights of the women in light of the teaching of Islam.

6. School Awareness Program

School Management Committees activation: Project team with coordination of Schools Education and Literacy Departments Activated and functional 08 SMCs having 62 parents and teacher members for the betterment of the schools and to utilize and manage funds for schools.

Awareness raising training regarding Child Labor & health hazardous for children in cotton production activities : 429 Children enhanced their knowledge regarding Child Labor & health hazardous for children in cotton production activities and daily good health and hygiene practices through 39 training sessions with children club to raise awareness about the importance of education specially for girls

Highlights of Q-3 (April-20 To June-20)

Capacity Building of Staff:

- 1. REEDs Capacity building department along with lead trainers Muhammad Imran IPM specialist M.Sc Hons- Agri, Mr. Muhammad Nasir Senior Sustainable Program Manager, conducted online two day training session for project team focusing on Farmer Business School approach, benefit and farmers farm management & importance, Nutrition Management of cotton crop and refresher of cotton pest & IPM for cotton grower.
- 2. One Day staff trainings on topic of Anemia and MHM training was held at Project office. Miss Farah Ameen (Master Trainer DDC) facilitated the session by covers all aspects of the topic. 8 female's staff enhanced their capacity to further replicate this training with females' farmers groups.
- 3. REEDS with coordination of Fuji Fertilizer Company (FFC) organized an virtual training of farmers and REEDS field staff on fertilizer management on local language. REEDS-Pakistan Rajanpur team with VGs members joined the training by following the webinar link. Training proves very informative and fruitful to deliver the Agriculture related training sessions in field.
- 4. Five females field executives along with Project coordinator attended 3 hrs online Training session regarding ""Ending Violence Against Women and GBV during Pandemic" organized by UN women and Hashoo Foundation on 18th June session was facilitated Ms. Ayesha Khan, Country Director

Hashoo Foundation and Ms. Zainab Ali Khan , Gender Specialist & Founding Working Group Member of Every Woman Treaty.

Capacity Building Trainings of Farmers

Using Technology And Local Leadership To Approach Farmers: Project team continue visits the village groups for awareness regarding Corona Virus Prevention according to WHO and District Authorities instructions for Covid-19 prevention and safety measures with a different strategy to delivered the message to maximum people through advisory sessions with 3 to 5 farmers members /group leaders. Group leader took the responsibility to replicate the information among other member farmers. Group leaders/ Field Team made What's app and SMS groups of VGs members and send information to meet

maximum utilization of technology during lockdown. Mosques announcements were also made day after days about to act upon REEDS & Govt.'s message.

1. Community Leaders Take Charge To Keep Their Homes And Families Hygienic And Safe From COVID : 8856 farmers trained mobilized and Motivated to adopt safely managed water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) at home as an essential part of preventing and protecting human health during infectious disease outbreaks.

2. Awareness sessions regarding Preventions from Covid-19: Project team with the coordination of Social Welfare Office Rajanpur visited to village groups and delivered awareness sessions regarding Corona Virus and locusts Prevention and control to 8856 farmers in 312 VGs according to WHO given guidelines for Covid-19 prevention and safety measures. Field team assured social distancing and also used announcements in Mosques, distributed masks and awareness brushers & pamphlets in community, asking people to act upon REEDS & Govt.'s message to "Stay home stay safe".

3. Female Farmers acquire knowledge_on **basic concepts, advantages and ways of savings at HH level** to improve culture of saving among females groups and for their better life. They have more clarity on each financial area and therefore a clearer direction for the saving. 12 saving groups also initiated in this month.

4. REEDS females team reaffirm ongoing commitment to raising awareness about **anemia and iron deficiency** and its debilitating symptoms, females farmers have a significant impact on their' well-being and quality of life and hence trained to properly diagnosed and addressed after awareness.

5. Males F.Es conducted training sessions in field According to the SOPs related to Covid-19. And trained farmers about FBS Importance for farmers, benefits – methodology and Agriculture as a business.

6. 143 females and 89 male farmers and lead farmers attended first time in their life "Digitized Capacity Building session on Profitable Cotton Production" organized by REEDS and Fuiji Fertilizer Company, this session has increased their confidence and self-esteem to interact with digital tools and boost their interest.

Highlights of Q-3 (April-20 To June-20)

7. Capacity building training session regarding "Methods and benefits of group marketing" Rajanpur team, Male Field Executive delivered 126 training sessions to 3592 male farmers about "Agriculture as a business, Similarities in agriculture and business, calendar of cotton, business cycle of forming, Formation and components of "Farm business plan", record keeping" and Methods and benefits of group marketing.

8. Communication Event (Farmers Conference cotton Challenges and Loctus Management) In locusts' attacks perspective, cotton pest control and COVID-19, two communication events were organized with collaboration of Agri Department. Agriculture department official elaborated about prevention of cotton crop from the locust's attacks and pest control. FBS farmers also presented their currents threats to the cotton and demanded Govt department to take steps to minimize the loss.

Outreach Activities:

1. Follow-up of Kitchen gardening : During the weeks of lockdown, there have been some of people facing trouble with securing some vegetables and fruits. However, on follow up feed back on the other hand, farmers growing vegetables at home, appreciated PBSP and their own efforts that are coming well in use during the lockdown. As in some village groups vegetables had been grown and farmers started to cook Lady finger "Bhindi" at their homes.

2. Drawing/ Painting activity among children: 5 children club groups with 25 children participated drawing activity regarding WASH and Child Rights, participation gave them a platform for to bring out their hidden potential and talents. Children felt that they were recognized; their ideas taken in to consideration, helped and supported.

3. Education Importance Awareness Walk Two child rights caring walks organized by the farmers groups and field team with objective to encourage community to join together with peers to walk for 4,00 steps in solidarity with children simply to get access their basic right to education.

4. MHDay-2020 More Local Action Than Ever Before: MH Day field team organized three MH Day events to raise awareness, educate female farmers and girls and catalyst section on MHM in three villages. Awareness and communication can help break barriers and end taboos surrounding menstruation to normalize periods. Participants made their own bracelets and will use them to strengthen MHM advocacy–on MH Day and beyond! 75 MHM Kits distributed to the participants .

5. Training of LHWs/VG Leaders/Community members regarding child health & rights and health effects due to child labor : Field staff arranged training essions with LHWs and village groups leaders about the child health and effects of child labor on children health. 27 LHWs and Farmers acquired knowledge and sensitized about child labor that deprives children of their childhood, Its causes and consequences of child labour, the importance of schooling to improve children's future prospects, and the negative impacts of child labor on children's health.

6. Skill Promotion Training & Identification of Potential Partners: Field staff arranged skill promotional trainings at VG level with Miss Nida Ameen (Skill promotional trainer, NRSP). In these trainings Rubina Mansoor(Project Coordinator, FBSP) Demonstrated about the importance of skill promotional trainings specially for women. Miss Nida Ameen told the participants there are different kinds of skill promotional trainings.

Highlights of Q-4 (July-20 To Sept-20)

Capacity Building of Staff:

1. One day training organized for FBSP project team regarding Pre-Harvesting (Cotton Picking-Safe and Clean) Project Coordinator conducted physical trainings of the staff 11 field Executives enhanced their knowledge.

2. A capacity building of field staff conducted in the first week of the September. Rubina Mansoor (Project Coordinator) gave a training session to the field executives on "End-line assessment of project beneficiaries and filling up questionnaire"

Capacity Building Trainings of Farmers

1. Awareness sessions regarding Preventions from Covid-19, :

Project team with the coordination of Social Welfare Office Rajanpur visited the village groups and delivered awareness sessions regarding Corona Virus and locusts Prevention and control to 9360 farmers in 312 VGs according to WHO given guidelines for Covid-19 prevention and safety measures. Field team assured social distancing and also used announcements in Mosques, distributed masks and awareness brushers & pamphlets in community, asking people to act upon REEDS & Govt.'s message to "Stay home stay safe".

COVID Awareness and precautionary measure and SOPs guidelines remained the part of regular training agenda. Project team with the coordination of Social Welfare Office Rajanpur conveyed messages regarding Corona Virus and locusts Prevention and control as per WHO & and Agriculture department. Field team assured social distancing and also spread the words through Mosques, distributed masks and awareness brushers & pamphlets in community.

2. Capacity building training session regarding "Methods and benefits of group marketing"

Rajanpur team, Male Field Executive delivered 126 training sessions to 3592 male farmers about "Agriculture as a

business, similarities in agriculture and business, calendar of cotton, business cycle of forming, Formation and components

of "Farmbusiness plan", record keeping" and Methods and benefits of group marketing.

Field team used methodology of discussion with the participants and pre question related to the topic and post questionings and answers. Field Executives demonstrated the above mentioned on a panaflex to make the participants more understand by pictorial view. Team adopted Safety measures against Corona virus, assured social distancing and made a strategy to deliver the message to maximum people.

3. Training of women farmers regarding Food preservation techniques

- Females farmers enhanced capacity on running, handling, care, maintenance and Safety standards mandatory for food processing and preservation for different summer fruits and vegetables unit as a source of good income generation in the village surroundings were delivered. Demonstration of (vegetable drying, dairy products preservation (Pickle, Jam, Ketchup -Butter & Desi Ghee), homemade tomato ketchup preparation and marketing.
- 3 females started their own business of making Ketchup, pickle and butters, while their husband support them in marketing the items. REEDS-Pakistan hired a consultant for trainings of female farmers on "Food preservation techniques". Field team identified female farmers for the trainings in 05 Union councils, Hajipur, Jahanpur , Umarkot, Kotmithan and Sikhani Wala, of district Rajanpur.

4. Training of farmers regarding Clean Cotton picking:

To get financial benefit of cotton yield, Clean Cotton picking trainings enhanced 10150 farmers (6085 females & 4065 males) knowledge to improved the practices and behavior of both farmers and pickers to improve cotton quality, including picking at suitable times; picking in the right direction; and better handling after picking (keeping the cotton on a cloth, not spraying water on picked cotton, trash free cotton). Emphasized was given to knowledge of health benefits of adopting safe practices by using PPES and no child labor at field.

Outreach Activities:

1. Training of LHWs/VG Leaders/Community members regarding child health & rights and health effects due to child labor

Field staff arranged training sessions with LHWs and village groups leaders about the child health and effects of child labor on children health. 27 LHWs and Farmers acquired knowledge and sensitized about child labor that deprives children of their childhood, Its causes and consequences of child labour, the Importance of schooling to improve children's future prospects, and the negative impacts of child labor on children's health.

2. Skill Promotion Training & Identification of Potential Partners: Field staff arranged 02 skill promotional trainings at VG level with Miss Nida Ameen (Skill promotional trainer, NRSP). In these trainings Rubina Mansoor(Project Coordinator, FBSP) Demonstrated about the importance of skill promotional trainings specially for women. Miss Nida Ameen told the participants there are different kinds of skill promotional trainings. NRSP and IRM conducted skill promotional trainings to rural communities to uplift their life Standards.

3. Global Breastfeeding Week Collectively Celebrated :

Field team celebrated Breast feeding week (1st-7th August 2020) under theme "Support Breastfeeding for a Healthier Planet" in five VGs with midwives, new mothers and expecting mothers urges to only feed their children breast milk during the age of 0 to 6 months, investments in breast feeding to make life smoother, myths and facts about breastfeeding on mother and child health with different quotes. Some special sessions to celebrate male partner, and family in a big way to described the role and responsibilities of family especial husband (Father) during breast feeding period. VG leaders took responsibility to spread this message through their respective VGs.

4. Skill Promotion Training With Collaboration Of NRSP:

REEDS arranged skill promotional sessions at VG level with the facilitation of National Rural Support Program and shared the skills importance to uplift living standard especially for women and girls, opportunities and linked up the 27 females farmers and their daughters with NRSP from VGs to facilitate skills trainings as per their criteria.

5. Supported Anti- Polio Campaign with Coordination of District Health Department:

The first polio immunization campaign in the district during COVID-19 pandemic has achieved. REEDS field team impart one week Polio Awareness drive before the campaign. Farmers and parents provided information on polio, its consequences on child life, prevention from polio, dates of polio days which are announced 15th -19th August 2020 by district Health Authorities.

237 children facilitated for polio vaccination through Health polio team.

6. Training Of Lhws / Health Committee Member Regarding Child Health & Rights And Health Effects Due To Child Labor

• LHWs/health volunteers acquired knowledge and sensitized about to play their role in elimination of child labor during cotton picking season as child labor deprives children of their childhood, its causes and consequences of child labor, the importance of schooling to improve children's future prospects, and the negative impacts of child labor on children's health.

7. Celebrations of Word Literacy Day:

End line Assessment of Project Beneficiaries

Project team conducted the end-line assessment of project beneficiaries in 03 tehsils of district Rajanpur and collected data on a prescribed survey form by going door to door in all related Village groups. Project staff met the farmers and fill out forms by asking questions from registered farmers of VGs. During the survey Project Coordinator made continuously monitoring visits and cross checked the forms and identified the gaps of field staff. Field teams faced some difficulties during the assessment due to recent flood water in district Rajanpur and cotton picking season. REEDS-Pak Rajanpur team completed the end-line assessment of 6370 registered project beneficiaries.
